MAY 4, 2015**

Members of the Franklin City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 4, 2015, 6:00 p.m. at the Franklin City Building, Mayor Denny Centers presiding.

There were two members of the press and 21 visitors at tonight's meeting. Also present: Mr. Jonathan Westendorf, Fire Chief; Mr. Ross Coulton, Assistant Safety Director; Mrs. Karen Ervin, Finance Director; Ms. Donnette Fisher, Law Director; Mr. Sonny Lewis, City Manager and Mrs. Jane McGee, Clerk of Council.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Lee Dunlap.

**PRESENTATION - JUDGE RUPERT E. RUPPERT**

Judge Ruppert stated that Mr. Lewis asked him to come tonight to give Council an update and noted the following:

- Moving forward with the Drug Docket – not certified for a Drug Court
- Remodeled the Probation Department for the Secretary's office
- Partitioned off the Conference Room (outside the Court Room) for the Magistrate & Public Defender offices
- Introduced Mr. Greg Demos, new Magistrate, and noted he is well respected throughout the community and started work today
- Will be visiting 3 Drug Courts to see how they operate and handle things to aid in our plan; expect to be up and running in mid-June
- 27 on vivitrol program now; some relapse and explained the process
- Looking forward to and think we can help people, not everyone will succeed
- At least one every week into the program, 4-6 per month; 60-70 on probation
- We are moving forward

Mr. Aldridge asked how receptive they are to the program. Judge Ruppert stated there are those who don't want help and aren't serious about it; about 90% of the people that come in that are hooked on heroin want to try for various reasons and they are in bad shape; and for most, being on the program, they are doing very well thus reducing crime, helping families, etc.

Mr. Aldridge then asked about those who decline the vivitrol, are they still a participant of the Drug Court and have to do testing, etc. Judge Ruppert stated they may decline vivitrol, as not everyone wants help, but they still have intensive probation, testing and have to report to Court and maybe even jail.

Mr. Faulkner asked when he will have any statistics. Judge Ruppert stated he'll try to have an update in 6 months to see where we are.

## RECEPTION OF VISITORS

Mr. Fred Abbott, 401 Sunnybrook, stated he'd like to see the speed sign be put on Sunnybrook as it has become a raceway.

Mr. Bray noted how nice his place looks.

Mr. Aldridge added that it is a busy street, especially with the kids walking to/from school.

## ORDINANCE 2015-05 PUBLIC HEARING AMENDING SECTIONS 935.01 AND 935.99 AND ENACTING SECTIONS 935.02 THROUGH 935.05 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, OHIO

Ms. Fisher stated that this amends the Park Rules & Regulations. These changes came about because of Mr. Wittington, resident, having an issue with the sign "No Guns in the Park". The State has taken over control of guns and we cannot pass regulations that are in conflict. Changes are made to Section 935.01 (25), and 935.03 thru 935.05 to reflect this. Also, added language for a school safety zone as we have a unique situation with the School premises and activities in the Park. We are working with the School to define guns in the Park and to make the Park a school safety zone. Also updated Section 935.01, definitions, which hasn't been updated since 2000. There's been some confusion on the definition of Alcohol in the Park – it is not allowed in the Park unless it is a City sponsored event and have to have a permit from the State. Also updated definitions for fireworks and music, to be allowed for City sponsored events only, added new section for public gatherings and the rental of Park facilities and updated the penalty section.

The Park Board recommends these changes and the Council Park Board has also reviewed and recommends the changes.

Mr. Wilcher asked who determines if it is a City sponsored event. Ms. Fisher stated it is an event that the City sponsors. Mr. Wilcher stated other entities that rent the Park, they would not be allowed to sell alcohol. Ms. Fisher stated that is correct. Mr. Wilcher asked that he, on behalf of the Franklin Historical Society would not be able to go into the Park to sell beer to raise money. Ms. Fisher stated that's correct.

Mr. Bray asked about the firearms, how strict are we going to be with that. Ms. Fisher stated it will be dealt with on a complaint basis and we are working with the School on a lease for the entire Park.

Mayor Centers asked about the School lease for the Park. Ms. Fisher stated that there is a lease with them every year, current lease expired the end of 2014.

Mr. Hall stated the School uses the Park all during the year for the different sports. Ms. Fisher stated we are concerned as it is confusing to residents as to how the State law is written. As soon as we get the lease, we will put up school safety zone signs at the Park.

Mr. Faulkner stated his concern is mainly the alcohol provision. He thinks everyone's intentions are good, has expressed his frustration to the City Manager, don't think the communication on the July 4<sup>th</sup> event has been very good. It was talked about at the last retreat, but no details. There are a group of residents who don't want alcohol in the Park, been talking with people the last couple of weeks about this and they feel the Park should be a safe zone; School Board President not in favor of alcohol and has concerns with it; and see a contradiction between this and guns in the park. I'm going to oppose changing the language—representing those against it. We never said we needed to offset costs for the fireworks.

Mr. Bray stated he's on Finance Committee, we spend money for events and we have a budget that we have to live within for all the events. He applauds the group and Chief Westendorf for coming up with ways to help re-coup money, booth fees, etc. We want to make the fireworks bigger and better and the additional income stream helps. Mr. Faulkner stated it's their money to spend and we spend more money on the pool and lose money on the pool.

Mr. Faulkner stated he's against City personnel selling alcohol – understands that's the intent for Special Event members to do, and doesn't understand how any public entity can do that.

Mr. Hall stated after the last meeting, no questions were asked what this was going to be. If you put out a general statement to the residents asking 'are you in favor of alcohol in the Park' you are going to get people all fired up and say no. That's not what is intended. This is just for one event, that we are in charge of and sponsor; understand concerns; don't know what will or what won't happen; have visited places that have alcohol; brought up by the Committee to help with money, to make a place people want to come to.

Mr. Faulkner added have had no details on this. Mr. Hall stated the assumption is that alcohol is going to be at the Park all the time. Mr. Faulkner stated he was very specific when talking to people. Mr. Hall added that the residents were getting upset about alcohol being in the Park all the time and that's not true.

Mayor Centers stated he's talked with several people and the School Board President and they thought alcohol was going to be sold all over the Park. Safety is an issue and the Police Department will be there – don't think it could be any safer. Other places in town sell alcohol without the Police Department present. This will be in a small place, very well controlled, let's try it one time and see what happens.

Ms. Fisher stated the requirement of the State is to have a designated area – can't walk around the Park with an open container. Mr. Faulkner asked about City liability. Ms. Fisher stated there is rider to our insurance policy.

Mr. Aldridge asked Chief Westendorf to explain how the beer garden will be set up.

Chief Westendorf stated we haven't gotten into all the specific details yet as the rules and regulations hadn't been changed yet. If it is approved, we will have control so we can deal with any problems; shut it down if need to; located between the pool and the fence of the outfield of the baseball field, between the parking lot and concession stand; will walk into designated area; hope to have bands; nothing committed to except for the fireworks; will have swat team & k-9 demonstrations, Care flight, & Premiere Health operating a first aid tent; want to have a safe event; been involved in other events, in other communities and never had an issue; will have food trucks, live bands, inflatables and rock climbing wall for kids;

preliminary cost of alcohol is \$4.00 can; hope to bring in out of town residents also, and this is an experiment, hope it continues to be long term.

Mr. Bray asked about the fireworks. Chief Westendorf stated they will be shot off across the street from the Park, on the Powers land by Hampton Bennett and that local residents will probably be able to see them from their homes. He added he has one shot to be impressive so people will come back. The pool will be open. We want to keep people cool and entertained; don't want people just sitting there in the hot sun. He believes that not providing activities is more of a risk than providing activities in a safe manner.

Mr. Faulkner stated, in reference to Mr. Hall's remarks, he's not for sensationalizing things in regards to any communication that came from his household. One of the comments he heard, was the Park Rules have been there long time; perhaps put there for a reason; if we have to go down this road to have the event, maybe we can't afford to have it. Also heard from a lot of people, people who drink and those that don't, about people drinking responsible.

Mr. Wilcher stated he has respect for what Mr. Faulkner is saying. He's having problems with this; polled Facebook, called relatives and friends and they said they thought it would be okay. I have great respect for Heather and understand why they don't want beer in the Park. He doesn't think this is a revenue stream; think it will draw a different crowd, not just catering to families or beer drinkers, catering to both; friends say to try it and if it doesn't work, stop it. I'm willing to give it a try, have faith in the Police & Fire Departments and Special Events to do it right, keep it safe and keep the City's liabilities to a bare minimum.

Mayor Centers stated he agrees, let's try and if it doesn't work, don't do again.

Mr. Lipps stated he doesn't drink beer, but has some experience with this. Involved with selling beer (Optimist Club) in Lebanon at the Blues Fest, made \$33,000, not held in Park but held on City street; control won't be an issue, possible accident yes; Waynesville considered beer for the Sauerkraut festival, but citizens didn't want it; does our residents want it, did we do anything to contact our residents; Rotary Club sold beer downtown a couple of years ago, and lost money; questioned the cost of the insurance rider (\$200-\$300 City); didn't know we made decisions for Special Events based on revenues vs expenses, won't help us if an organization sells and not the City; is a great idea but have concerns i.e. parking & traffic, and need public feedback.

Mr. Wilcher stated we haven't got a sampling of what residents want and he's having a hard time with this.

Mr. Aldridge stated we didn't sample the residents if they wanted fireworks; have to trust the Committee; think it will be a good event and if they are doing to drink, they will drink before they get there.

Mr. Faulkner stated his concern is they don't want beer in the Park, it's the venue.

Mr. Lipps told of an incident, accidental fire that happened at a breakfast held at Lebanon High School. We'll have control, it's the accidental incident that we have no control of.

Mr. Aldridge added he thinks social media is not reliable.

Mr. Hall stated the Finance Committee did not ask for a revenue stream; was brought to us and we agreed with it; still have no problem with it; he's in the Park a lot, understand the concerns with alcohol in the Park; accidents can happen anytime, have had past events with alcohol with no problem; and we want to make this a big event so people will come back.

Mr. Lipps added he received 9 calls about dogs in the Park and 2 calls about alcohol in the Park.

Mayor Centers opened the Public Hearing and asked for any public comments.

Heidy Seins, 5371 Tama Lane, stated she's not a City resident but has been involved with the youth organizations - Soccer, Pee Wee Football & FRA baseball. Also has served 11 years on the Franklin School Board. She voiced her opposition to alcohol in the Park, even for one event; think it will open the door for other organizations and issues.

Mr. Wilcher stated he has those same concerns. Ms. Fisher stated it will be controlled. The group would have to apply for a F2 permit and a requirement of the permit is that they have to submit a form signed by the City stating they have permission to do it on City property.

Ms. Seins stated it's also sending the wrong message to the kids – it's in contradiction to what we are teaching our children through the Dare Program, which is supported by the Police Department and to what Judge Ruppert talked about earlier.

Mr. Aldridge added that it is legal.

Heather Faulkner, 640 Harpwood Drive, stated she respects the Special Events Committee, they work hard and do a great job for our community. Her issue is with alcohol in the Park; she personally has issues with drinking; need to set a good example for our kids; and questioned putting this on the ballot to let the people decide. Ms. Fisher stated per the Charter, the citizens can do a referendum to put it on the ballot.

Mrs. Betsy Westendorf, 430 Harpwood Drive, representing the Special Events Committee and the Park Board, says there have been no changes in the Park rules for a long time; trying to move forward with new events; tried an event at the Park several years ago and it didn't work; trying to have this in the Park, with the pool, inflatables, alcohol will be contained and is priced so it's not available to everyone; Springboro sells alcohol at the Concerts in the Park and have no problems & talked to them about this; if problem, won't do again, don't want to fail, want to have an amazing event, and want everyone to come back.

Mr. Faulkner stated he thought the previous 4<sup>th</sup> of July event was a great event – thought the problem was it wasn't advertised very well.

Mrs. Westendorf stated there were some issues with getting to the Park after the parade; people having family cook-outs; trying to expand things; we've adjusted our current events over the years; we just want support in trying new ideas, if it works support us, if it doesn't work, tell us to shut it down.

Chief Westendorf stated it's the Special Events Committee, including Heather when she was a member, that does all the work, all-day events; total 15-16 people now, they all work very hard; understand some won't like it; we are just asking for the opportunity to try.

Mayor Centers thanked the Special Events Committee and appreciate the comments from Heather and Heidi.

Mayor Centers closed the Public Hearing and asked for any Council comments.

Mr. Bray made the motion to adopt Ordinance 2015-05; seconded by Mr. Hall. The vote:

LIQUOR PERMIT TRANSFER   TRANSFER OF C1 AND C2 (BEER AND WINE FOR CARRY  
OUT ONLY) PERMITS FROM WALGREEN CO., 2203 BEECHMONT AVENUE, CINCINNATI, TO  
WALGREEN CO., 1300 E. SECOND STREET, FRANKLIN

Mr. Lewis stated that this is a transfer between stores and that the Manager is hoping to increase sales.

Mayor Centers stated he didn't think you could transfer a permit from one City to another City. Mr. Lewis stated he didn't either. Originally, we did sign a letter for a transfer from the Miamisburg Store saying we didn't object. Then we received this transfer from the Cincinnati Store. We are assuming that the Cincinnati Store is one of their stores to be closed.

Ms. Fisher stated that this is a new license TREX – a transfer made for economic development purposes. We signed a letter to say we agree to, but doesn't mean the State will approve it.

Discussion continued on this type of license, has to be a transfer of the license and that the City always has the ability to object and request a hearing.

There being no motion made to request a hearing, this will be returned to the State with no request for a hearing.

RESOLUTION 2015-22   PRELIMINARY LEGISLATION GRANTING CONSENT TO ODOT FOR

Mr. Lewis stated that this is required by ODOT. State Route 123 is being repaved this year and outside the scope of work, the State is repairing a culvert outside the City limits, with some ditch and grading work inside the City limits. ODOT is requiring the legislation to allow them to do the work that is inside the City limits.

**RESOLUTION 2015-23 AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF POLICE CRUISERS FOR THE DIVISION OF POLICE THROUGH THE STATE PURCHASING PROGRAM AND THE EQUIPPING OF THE SAME**

Mr. Lewis stated that this authorizes the purchase of two new Dodge Charger Police cruisers. They will replace the 2006 (doesn't run) & 2007 (trade-in) Dodge Charger cruisers. The cost for two chargers is \$50,214.00 and to equip the cruisers is approximately \$39,078.16, not to exceed \$40,000.00. Mr. Lewis added that this has been to the Council Finance Committee and they approved the purchase 2-1.

Mr. Faulkner asked if they're still happy with the Chargers as he has heard there are some issues. Mr. Coulton stated he hasn't heard any complaints and design changes are being made to the vehicles.

Mr. Hall asked what happens with the equipment from the old cars. Mr. Coulton stated the radios are used and they re-use everything that they can. Sometimes can't reuse the equipment if the car design has changed, are worn out and some just can't be used.

Mr. Hall stated that this was talked about at the Council Finance Committee meeting about what happens with the equipment. Also, equipment costs have increased which has almost doubled the cost of the vehicle.

Mr. Bray stated he brought this up at the Finance Committee meeting and numerous other times. When we went to the Chargers, we were told the equipment will be re-used; know technology is changing; equipment cost almost as much as car cost; maybe we should go back to using the same cars and replacing the cars every three years.

There was some discussion on this.

Mayor Centers asked about the cost for all new equipment vs re-using what we can. Mr. Coulton stated radios will be reused; don't know what that cost will be, but there is a cost to strip out the equipment and cost to re-install, whether new or used equipment.

Mr. Aldridge stated we are replacing 8 & 9 year old vehicles. Mr. Bray added it is getting expensive to equipment the cars.

Discussion continued on the equipment costs and the vehicles.

Mr. Lewis stated that this adds the full-time Magistrate; deletes the part-time Small Claims Magistrate and the part-time Acting Finance Director.

Mr. Faulkner asked if when we start receiving statistics and they don't support what the Judge presented, do we have to wait until the next Judge to mandate we not have a full-time Magistrate or can we choose not to fund it and see if the Court orders it again. What are our options if the Magistrate isn't a good value for us? Ms. Fisher stated that it is the Judge's decision to have the Magistrate, whether it is part-time or full-time. The City has to fund it, unless you say the City isn't funding it and the Court orders it, then it will go to the Appeal Courts and we have to prove that it is unreasonable.

Mr. Lipps stated that, currently, there is discussion at the County level and pending legislation at the State level. We get the next year under our belt with statistics, and see what the County and State do, think this is a good way to proceed.

**RESOLUTION 2015-25 AMENDING RESOLUTION 2015-13, ESTABLISHING THE ORGANIZATIONAL LISTINGS AND PAY RATES FOR THE CITY OF FRANKLIN OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES FOR THE YEAR 2015**

Mr. Lewis stated that this establishes the salary for the Magistrate at \$85,000 plus benefits, approximately \$128,280 total. The salary for the part-time magistrate is \$10,000+ and the County paid 40% of the salary. They will continue to pay the 40% on the time he (F/T Magistrate) spends on small claims. Mr. Lewis added he has called Warren County to see if they will pay 40/60 on the entire salary but they don't have to do that.

Mr. Bray stated he is furious about this, having to spend \$128,000 of the City's income tax money that could be used for street paving, etc. because three of the members voted no, went over to the Warren County Commissioners and had them not to vote to have this go through so we would pay \$20,000 for a

full-time judge. This is absolutely absurd, I'm so upset that we are spending \$100,000 of tax payers dollars, year after year, because you guys wanted your own agenda. That is absolutely wrong. Mr. Wilcher stated he's also upset and that Mr. Bray also had an agenda. The costs were not that far apart. Discussion continued between Mr. Bray & Mr. Wilcher on the cost. Mr. Wilcher stated that certain individuals fueled and pushed this through and he's confused, let's have beer at the Park but we needed a Drug Court. Mr. Bray stated we're spending \$100,000 of the tax payer's money because you guys didn't want to have a full-time Judge. Mr. Wilcher stated we were going to be spending close to that and then be stuck with it. Mr. Bray stated that is wrong, the number was \$20,000. Mr. Wilcher stated that is incorrect – Mr. Bray stated that it's right.

Mr. Lipps stated that it's not even close. Mr. Lipps asked how does he sleep at night when he lies at Council. Mr. Bray added it's absurd what they have done – hundred thousand dollars of tax payers money. Mr. Lipps stated they have tried to protect the citizen's tax payer's money but your personal agenda screwed all of us. Mr. Bray stated he did not have a personal agenda on this item. Mr. Lipps stated that he did on that item. Mr. Bray stated that you all think I'm in coots with the Judge; the Judge doesn't pay my salary; he does nothing for me; that's your guys personal agenda, you don't like the Judge and didn't want him to get his retirement (full-time); and he doesn't care about the Judge's retirement. Mr. Faulkner stated he (the Judge) does. Mr. Bray added he cares about Franklin. Mr. Faulkner stated he does too; he's heard enough, you're entitled to your opinion and we're entitled to ours.

Discussion and disagreement continued on the costs.

Mr. Lewis stated that the third lane, on Second Street in front of Cazadores, will be finished soon. Also, the bids will be opened next week for the SR 123 turn lane and the municipal street paving projects.

#### LAW DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Fisher stated to remember the Farmer's Market, have 20 vendors to date. Also we are having problems getting corporate sponsors for the shopping bags.

#### COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mr. Hall stated we had a good Council Finance Committee meeting tonight and Karen did a wonderful job; at the corner of Martha Drive/David Blvd., a truck is on jacks, straddling the sidewalk with no tires, it needs checked; and the Finance Committee approved funding for the Warren County Kustoms Car Show in August.

Mr. Aldridge thanked everyone for coming tonight.

Mr. Bray thanked Special Events Committee for all they do; and the last meeting was awesome, we are looking at doing different things for our residents and think we are moving in the right direction.

Mr. Lipps stated to remember to vote tomorrow for the Warren County Career Center levy and remember the Community Outreach Day on Friday at the Fire Department.

Mr. Wilcher stated there are 4 tires stacked up across from Pilot; and if we do a work session, maybe in June, need to talk about the downtown.

Consensus is to have a work session sometime this summer when everyone is available.

Mr. Faulkner stated that Special Events Committee is awesome, he appreciates them and that he had to vote his conscious tonight; heard there was a May Day Festival on the VFW property and they were getting into things, besides music, that weren't legal, and asked if anyone knew anything about this. Captain Coulton stated if they're having events there, they are supposed to come to the Police Department and have the Police Chief sign off on it. We heard there was a festival there last year and the Police Department wasn't contacted.

Mayor Centers thanked Special Events for all their hard work, it is appreciated; how do you get rid of an old TV; what's going on with the Train Depot, maybe Mr. Frosty's could use it (noted that Mr. Frosty's sold this week). Mr. Lewis stated it's not ADA complaint, no parking there and the City doesn't own the land, only the building. There was some discussion on this – consensus agreed, would like to see it used some way, if possible.
